Battery wall Guernsey



Overview

The Batterie Mirus is located in Saint Peter and Saint Saviour, Guernsey. Originally called Batterie Nina, it comprised four 30.5 cm guns. The battery was constructed from November 1941 and through the first half of 1942, and was the largest battery in the Channel Islands, the guns having a maximum range of 51 km.

In 1940 it was initially agreed that the defence of the Channel Islands would come under the remit of the German , so Marine Artillerie Abteilung 604 (MAA604) was.

The barrels, which were 15.85 meters long, were cast at the Obuchov foundry in 1914 and became the main armament for one of a series of .

The four gun battery was scattered over an area 1 km x 0.75 km. Some local civilians were evicted during the construction period, others after it was completed. Roads were closed and access restricted. A work camp for the OT.

Each of the four gun positions comprised the following: • 21m circular concrete pit to provide a base for a turret comprising central pin, inner walkway (to take the breech recoil when gun operating at maximum elevation), thin middle.

A naval crew of 72 men manned each gun and on 13 April 1942 the first test firing of gun No. 2 took place. The April demonstration was witnessed by several observers, including an official photographer, who stood too close and was thrown into a ditch.

When the Allies arrived in Guernsey, the guns were still intact, no orders had been given to sabotage them. The battery personnel were concentrated in local camps before being shipped to the UK as in empty . The drive to recover.

What was the largest artillery battery on Guernsey?

Of the eleven artillery batteries on Guernsey, the largest was located in Batterie Mirus, comprising four 30.5 cm guns which had a range of 51 kilometres (32 mi). Camouflage was used in defensive works by German engineers, as were burying or part burying structures to escape aerial observation and attack.

How much concrete was used in Guernsey?

The German Festung Guernsey book recorded 616,000m³ of concrete used in Guernsey, almost 10% of the concrete used in the Atlantic Wall. Of the eleven artillery batteries on Guernsey, the largest was located in Batterie Mirus, comprising four 30.5 cm guns which had a range of 51 kilometres (32 mi).

What was the largest gun battery in the Channel Islands?

The battery was constructed from November 1941 and through the first half of 1942, and was the largest battery in the Channel Islands, the guns having a maximum range of 51 km. Although the guns were removed in the early 1950s, the reinforced concrete structures and associated positions remain intact.

How long has Guernsey been fortified?

The island of Guernsey has been fortified for several thousand years, the number of defence locations and complexity of the defence increasing with time, manpower and the improvements in weapons and tactics.

Was Festung Guernsey impregnable?

Festung Guernsey (fortress Guernsey). Whether the Islands were impregnable was never tested, except for Battery Blücher in Alderney. Alderney was considered too well-protected against aircraft attack so HMS Rodney had the mission of shelling it. Rodney fired seventy-two 16-inch shells.

Did Guernsey pay for German troops?

Guernsey had to pay for the German troops, providing them with and paying for their food, accommodation and transport. 89 319 ID provided the bulk of troops for the whole of the Channel Islands, it became the largest division in the German army.
