Overview

The Mali Empire (: Mandé or Manden Duguba; : مالي, : Mālī) was an in from c. 1226 to 1670. The empire was founded by (c. 1214 - c. 1255) and became renowned for the wealth of its rulers, especially (Musa Keita). At its peak, Mali was the largest empire in West Africa, widely influencing the culture of the region through the spread of , laws, and customs.

Did Mali have a king?

Mali had kings, called Mansa. The Mali Empire would reach a height of strength during the reign of Mansa Musa I. Territorial expansion coincided with cultural advancements, particularly in architecture, and the empire flourished. Using his large army, Musa doubled the empire's territory.

What is the executive branch of Mali?

The executive branch consists of the President of Mali and the Government of Mali, led by the Prime Minister of Mali. Under Mali's 1992 constitution, the president is chief of state and commander in chief of the armed forces. The president is elected to 5-year terms by direct popular vote. He is limited to two terms.

How did Mali influence the culture of West Africa?

At its peak, Mali was the largest empire in West Africa, widely influencing the culture of the region through the spread of its language, laws, and customs. The empire began as a small Mandinka kingdom at the upper reaches of the Niger River, centered around the Manding region.

How did the Malian empire balance centralization and decentralization?

The Malian state balanced centralization and decentralization by dividing the empire into a series of provinces and vassal states that had been either conquered or annexed, respectively. These were administered in different ways. The Mali Empire reached its largest area under the Abubakrids, the lineage of Mansa Musa.

Does Mali have a security problem?

Mali, like many of its West African neighbors, continues to face significant security challenges. Transitional President Assimi Goita, who assumed power after a military coup in 2020, addressed the nation on September 21, during the country's 64th Independence Day celebrations.

Why did Mali lose the Battle of Mema & Timbuktu?

Despite their power in the west, Mali was losing the battle for supremacy in the north and northeast. The new Songhai Empire conquered Mema, one of Mali's oldest possessions, in 1465. It then seized Timbuktu from the Tuareg in 1468 under Sunni Ali Ber.

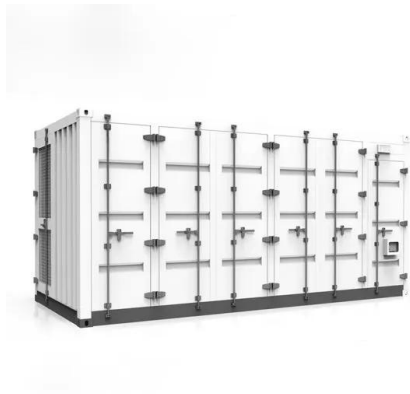

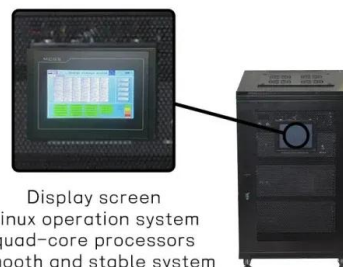


The Mali Empire

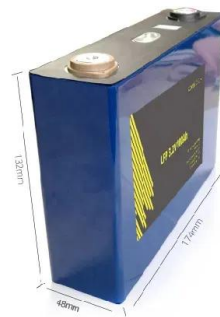
