Overview

How many wind farms are there in Norway?

Well-functioning, integrated markets and a well-developed power grid are an essential basis for this. At the beginning of 2023, there were 65 wind farms in Norway, with an installed capacity of 5073 MW. This corresponds to about 16.9 TWh in a normal year. Production from wind power plants fluctuates with weather conditions.

How much wind power does Norway produce?

Total wind power capacity is 4,649 MW. Wind power capacity in Norway increased by 706 MW in 2021. Norway produces 11.8 TWh from wind energy, which accounts for 8.5% of the country's electricity consumption. The total electricity production in 2021 in Norway was 157.1 TWh.

What is happening with wind power in Norway?

Decreasing LCOE of wind power projects, favourable depreciation rules, and the end of the electricity certificate scheme have driven the latest years' high-level deployment of wind power in Norway. There is significant activity in the regulatory space for both onshore and offshore wind power.

Why is Norway a good place for wind power?

These conditions are ideal for wind power as they provide plenty of power and predictable production. Parts of the Norwegian coast also have sea depths shallow enough to permit bottom-fixed turbines. Few countries can match Norway's knowledge and experience in offshore operations.

How many wind farms are there in Norway in 2021?

Wind power in Norway continued with a fairly high level of deployment, resulting in 706 MW of new installed capacity in 2021 and a net total installed capacity of 4649 MW at the end of the year. The electrical energy produced by the 64 active wind farms in 2021 was 11.8 TWh.

Does Norway have a target for wind energy production?

In practice, this means that Norway has no explicit target for national renewable production or for wind production as such. However, the electricity certificate scheme has been successful in incentivising investment decisions for the deployment of new wind energy installations in Norway over the last few years.

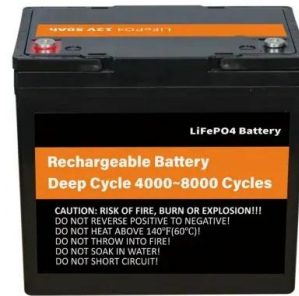

Norwegian Hydropower

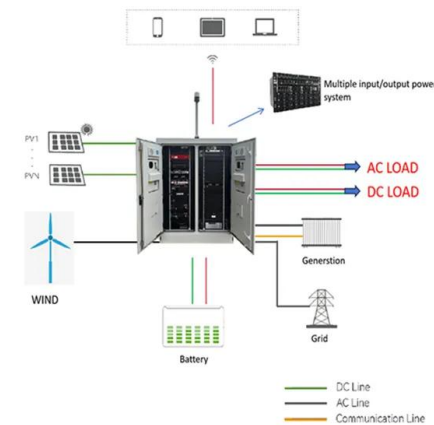
